





East Soar Outdoor Experience is situated on a National Trust farm in one of the most breathtaking parts of South Devon. On the headland, just above the picturesque town of Salcombe the location is perfectly suited to provide children and young people with an outdoor experience that will stay with them forever. The centre primarily provides outdoor educational opportunities for children with additional educational needs but also caters for mainstream groups. As we are situated on a National Trust Farm we work very closely with our local Rangers to ensure schools and families have access to our beautiful surroundings.

Programmes vary in length from half-day visits to week long residential trips.

We facilitate the whole experience which creates a unique 'family feel' to your trip. The activities are 'low risk' and designed to be accessible to children of all abilities, the emphasis is on building life skills. At its core every programme will have the social, emotional, personal and physical development of the individual. Programmes are designed with the needs and desired outcomes of each group in mind, whether that may be to have an enjoyable day in the great outdoors or to successfully complete a Duke of Edinburgh expedition. Several cross curricular links can be built into the programme and other awards and qualifications also

John Muir Award

The John Muir Award is an environmental award scheme focused on wild places. It encourages awareness and responsibility for the natural environment, in a spirit of fun, adventure and exploration. The Award is open to all, and is the educational initiative of the John Muir Trust. Four Challenges are at the heart of each John Muir Award; discover – explore – conserve – share.

We can facilitate the award as part of a day-visit or residential programme. Certificates available for achieving candidates.

Young Navigator Star Award

The focus of the Young Navigator awards is to encourage exploration and journeying in local areas using simple maps. There is a gradual learning progression via One Star (bronze), Two Star (silver) and Three Star (gold) levels with certificates and badges available for achieving candidates.

Facilities

East Soar Outdoor Experience is situated on seven and a half acres within the spectacular 600 acre East Soar Farm. The site comprises several stone barns, fields, paddocks and a small bit of woodland. The farm is home to Schalk, Marijke their 3 children and Daisy dog.

As well as the Walkers' Hut and ablution block the site offers accommodation in pre pitched bell tents and the Swallows' nest.

Sole use of the site ensures added safety and comfort of school groups. Boys and girls are separated and staff members are provided with their own sleeping accommodation.

The Walkers' Hut and other barns offer enough indoor space in the event of bad weather. As well as a new extensive vegetable garden; pet sheep, chickens, pigs, pony and donkeys provide children with the added opportunity to become involved and develop their own confidence. New pond dipping platforms for 2015 enable children to explore our extensive pond area. Children leave the centre with a feeling of achievement and pride in newly gained skills.

East Soar Outdoor Experience has established successful links with other outdoor education providers in the area, enabling schools to add some of these activities to their individual programme.

Meals

Meals are prepared freshly on site and all produce sourced locally.







Health and Safety

We pride ourselves on offering a safe environment for students and staff. All activities are done on site or the surrounding area. Marijke and Schalk are both CRB checked and first aid trained. East Soar Farm and all activities have been risk and fire assessed. All policies are available on request.

Pricing

Residential visits.

Prices range from £35 to £60 per student per night depending on activities and duration of stay.

Day workshops.

Prices range from £100 (half day) to £160 (full day). Maximum 30 students.





Daily Itineraries

Daily itineraries are discussed with schools and provided before arrival. Schools decide what activities they would like to do and we design a programme of events to suit the individual needs.
